

ALL SAINTS' CHURCH YELVERTOFT ANNUAL REPORT FROM THE PCC SECRETARY

The PCC continues to meet regularly, and in person meetings have re-commenced following the pandemic restrictions. Each meeting is preceded by Evening Prayer which enables us a quiet reflective time to prepare for the meeting ahead and pray for God's guidance in the work that we do. The PCC will continue to meet regularly over the coming year.

The meeting follows a regular agenda with members of the PCC presenting updates detailing the varied work that is required to keep the Church open for the whole community. Any major initiatives/repair work needs the approval of the PCC to proceed. As well as looking to the fabric of the building the PCC supports the rector in ensuring that mission and outreach is relevant and will allow our Church to thrive and grow.

Regular agenda items discussed at the meeting are:

- The work of the local Ministry Team.
- Reports from the Deanery Synod.
- Our current forms of worship and a review of our services and Church events to ensure that whilst maintaining traditions they are relevant and appropriate for today, enabling an active living Church. Services have been revised in some areas over the past year, which have been well received, with further changes planned.
- Mission and outreach initiatives for our Church to thrive and grow.
- Planning of Church events and Church fund raising.
- Remedial work to the fabric of the building, including arrangements for the maintenance of the church fabric and the churchyard and the payments required to carry these out. The work of the outreach project has been particularly helpful in maintaining the churchyard this year.
- Church management and finance.
- Safeguarding. A self audit is regularly undertaken and we get an update from the safeguarding officer but safeguarding remains our collective responsibility, including ongoing training on safeguarding matters as provided by the Diocese.
- Children's work. The need to inspire the future generation and welcome them in to the Church family is very important. Various events have been held this year, including those at the village school, and across the benefice.

We have enjoyed another busy year. As well as supporting the usual Sunday services, the Churchyard has been maintained and kept tidy and the church has remained open for everyone in the community, every day, during daylight hours. We are making plans for the return of the Church fete, and the Ladies' Fashion Show has also returned and was very successful.

The PCC would like to thank everyone who has supported the Church and its events over the past year, contributing their time and money to make them a success.

Our Church is a very important part of our community, allowing us to grow together in fellowship and strengthen our living faith. We encourage everyone to join us in celebrating God's unfailing love for us all and the joy, strength and peace of mind that comes from knowing Jesus.

- Simon Barsby has commenced work on the repairs and decoration to the ceiling and masonry work and to repair the lead flashing joint to the South aisle roof.
- The Wakeford family have had the Sycamore trees and suckers removed on boundary hedge on the Church drive at there own expense and have offered to replace with a native tree at a later date. This was approved by Archdeacon Ricard and did not require a faculty.
- Church drive Tom Wakeford is looking into repairs to be made.
- CPBS workers continue with the Churchyard maintenance and we are thankful for their attendance.
- Still waiting for Harvey White to replace the heating elements in the Church.
