

Shepherd's Delight Report from Rev Jo

Shepherd's Delight is still being enjoyed by Yelvertoft Primary School children and the team and we are told it is the most popular afterschool club in the school.

The children enjoy a snack together, games, bible stories, praying together, craft activities and fun and chatter. We regularly use, or adapt, the Jesus Story Bible in our sessions and bargain prised copies of these have been given to each Shepherd Delighter for use at home with their families. The craft activities are often designed so that the children are aided in retelling the bible story with their families.

Currently there are 17 children from reception to year 6 who attend every week. There are now spaces available which are being advertised in the school and among the families. Shepherd's Delight continues to enjoy a super relationship with the school's head teacher and staff.

The team has grown this year and now includes Barbara Brazier, Kerry Clayton, Anne Grant and myself with occasional help (which is hugely appreciated) from Sean Brazier, Judy Anderson, Harlene Griffiths and Rev Kris while he was with us. Everyone is up to date with their DBS check (or in the process of renewal), safeguarding training is ongoing and safer recruitment is completed for everyone on the team.

Since my curacy started last June, Barbara has very ably led the sessions when they clash with my curacy training. I currently prepare the material for her because of her time pressures (not because she is incapable). Kerry remains a faithful and thoughtful team member and Anne has led parts of some sessions too.

I would very much like to thank all the team for their amazing contribution to making Shepherd's Delight happen and to making it so enjoyable. Well done - you are stars!

At Yelvertoft All Saints we take Safeguarding very seriously.

We have a regular safeguarding update at all the PCC meetings, and I discuss any issues with Graeme the Rector on a regular basis.

Currently we are looking at a few new helpers at Shepherds Delight and they are going through the DBS checks and training process under Jo's guidance.

The January review for this year highlighted the need for some new training to be undertaken by some people.

I will contact the necessary people with the details of what and when they need to be doing this, and the correct access to the training for the Diocese.

I continue to be the Lead Safeguarding Officer; but Rev Graeme or Rev Jo are available to be approached with any concerns.
